Full Agenda for Nov. 8 TLIA Annual Meeting

On November 8 at 2 p.m., the Tower Lakes Improvement Association ("TLIA") will hold its annual meeting. This is a meeting, like all others, that are open to the public and residents are encouraged to attend. The meeting will be held at the Wauconda American Legion Hall, 515 S Main Street, Wauconda, IL 60084.

This year's meeting will feature the "State of the Association." Each Committee Chair will present their accomplishments from the past year, as well as their challenges for 2016. Youth, Social (now Events), Lake, and Communications will present reports. In addition, the membership will vote on the following items:

- Amendments to bylaws – fees for late dues payments
- Election of 2016 Board (See candidate bios on page 3)
- A common area property exchange

Each member is encouraged to attend the meeting and be a part of the decision making process. Why? Because it matters. In order for the above voting items to be adopted, and the meeting be sanctioned "official," we must have a quorum or 10% of the members in good standing. That means [insert number here] people are required to be in attendance. If we don't have a quorum, we can't hold an annual meeting or vote on any issues. Each member has the right to vote via proxy ballot – which will be mailed in early October to members in good standing; however, the proxy vote does not count toward the meeting quorum.

Increase in Dues

Over the past year, the Board has worked diligently to maintain the 2015 budget in a difficult environment. There was a very successful push to recover several thousand dollars of past membership dues from 2013 & 2014. "It's great to have recovered the money," said Randy Young, President of TLIA, "but it's collection of money for past budgets. It helps our overall financial balance sheet, but does little to move us forward into 2016 on initiatives that are important to the community." The Association will be raising dues \$50 per household (non-senior) and \$40 per household (senior) for 2016. A complete review of both the current financial status and projections for the future will show the necessity of the

increase. The 2016 budget was established as a result of consultation with committee chairs and TLIA suppliers.

Each member will receive, via mail, a copy of the new budget – which was approved by the Board at the September meeting – along with the official notice of the meeting.

Amendments to Bylaws

The Agenda will also include two (2) bylaw amendments.

The first was approved at the Board level in September. It will bring the Association compliant with revised state law regarding notifications to the membership.

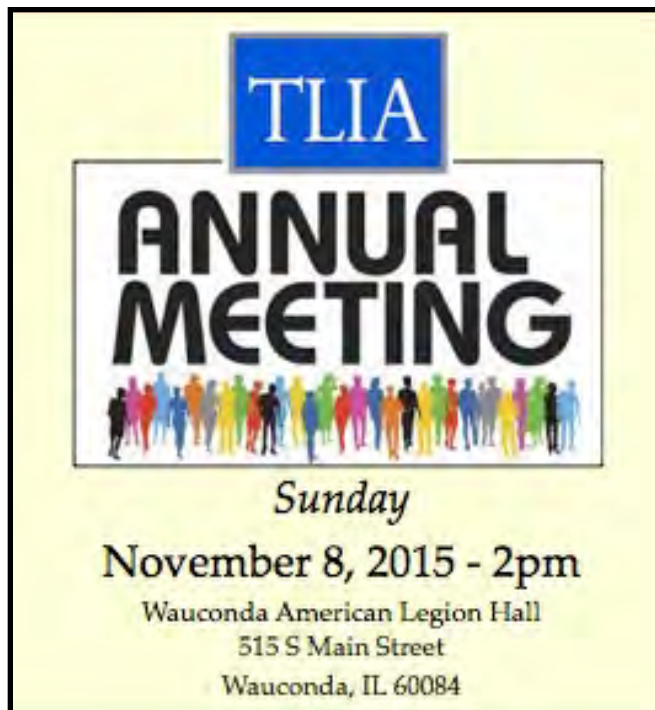
The second amendment deals with penalties for delay in paying membership dues. The bylaws currently use a compounded quarterly interest formula. The proposed amendment changes the formula to a scheduled due date and a single annual fine for the fiscal year. Members will still have the option of scheduling a payment plan with the Association prior to the due date in order to avoid penalty; however, it must be requested within the first ninety (90) days of the fiscal year to avoid a penalty. This amendment must be voted on by the membership to be included in the bylaws.

Election of 2016 Board Members

Other ballot issues on the agenda include a slate of five candidates running for four (4) open Board positions. Vice President and Financial Secretary position candidates are unopposed. There are three (3) candidates for the two (2) open

Member-at-Large positions. Each of the candidates brings their own individual abilities and talents to the Board. Please refer to page 3 to read the candidate bios and see their photos.

We hope you can take time out of your busy schedules to make the November 8 meeting. Your attendance and voting for the issues in our community are of vital importance. The decisions made at this meeting will have a direct and concrete effect on your daily life in Tower Lakes.

Neighbors admiring the brand new pole it was not. It was 3 teenage boys attempting to climb the pole. Yes, they were shimmying up our brand new pole and pulling on the rope lanyard for leverage. On the first day!!! That behavior is exactly what caused the damage to the old pole.

We approached the boys and explained that we were residents, that the pole was brand new, installed that day in fact. We mentioned its cost, and that, what they were doing was destructive, trespassing, and dangerous. We calmly explained that the new pole was installed because the old one was damaged as a result of just this sort of misbehavior. When asked their names, they refused to tell us and wanted nothing but to escape the discussion. They were nervous and it showed. Their last words, mumbled as they exited the island, were an assurance that it would not happen again. I took it, as anyone would, as "credible assurance" from teenage boys caught redhanded. I wish I had brought my phone!

I urge all of you with teens, and young people at home, please explain to them the potential issues of this kind of behavior and to respect our association's property. We have a great new asset on Rest Island that will continue to build our belief in our community. I hope the new flag pole can be dedicated to raising a new level of Tower Lakes Proud.

319 Grant Application

Nancy Schumm presented information and answered questions about the 319 IEPA Grant proposal process. The intent of the grant is to reduce the amount of water that flows on, over and under Bays Park in order to reduce nonpoint source pollution through the installation of a rain garden. The grant should be awarded sometime in March, and the long grant cycle allows for modifications to the original grant along the way.

TLIA LAKE COMMITTEE

Believe it or not we have had one of the fastest permit approvals in history. Our applications have been approved by US Army Corps of Engineers and by the Lake County Storm Water Management. We also have a final plan and budget, and both TLIA and the Village of Tower Lakes have approved funding to restore the pond-like depression at Lathan's Landing. Work will begin by the time you read this article. If dried and workable the area will be re-landscaped and reseeded this fall. The Grounds and Grounds Beautification Committee have been involved with the Silt Relocation Team to establish a final Re-landscaping plan that will include some wetland plants. This most likely will be tackled in the spring. Thank you, Nick Adams, for driving this project and the Village of Tower Lakes for their support and involvement in this Stormwater Management Project. Funding for this project was provided in part by the Lake County Stormwater Management Commission through a Watershed Management Board grant.

Lake maintenance – Overall the lake maintenance of aquatic plants was very good this past summer. Our contractor worked very closely with Judd Lautenschlager to monitor and apply herbicide in a timely and consistent manner. While we did have more algae this year and there was a heavy layer of plants under the surface, the lilies were controlled to our liking. We will ALWAYS have plants in the water. Our goal is to control the level and location of the plants.

PARC Comprehensive Plan Published at TLIA.org

What began at the November 2011 TLIA annual meeting where the membership approved \$75,000 for improving and enhancing the parks, ends with the beautiful park system we now have today. The effort included many volunteers, hard work and hired labor to complete its charter. TLIA BOARD August Board Minutes - Cont.

The grant is not funded with taxpayer money but rather by fines paid from environmental violations (such as oil spills). Money from these fines is dispersed in the form of grants to watersheds around the country. The value of the grant is \$159,750 (the total is \$242,000 including in-kind contributions such as volunteer time, meetings, and education). Trustee Joe Skurla stated that the Village wants to add swales instead of replacing pipes in Bays Park but would like to try the rain garden first. There will be outside assistance with maintenance (weeding) for the rain garden the first year. Acceptance of this grant will not cause the land will not become public land. Residents are encouraged to install similar rain gardens in their own yards. Nancy Schumm and a representative from Encap will attend next month's Board meeting to answer any additional questions.

Shoreline restoration project proposal

John Schmidt presented a plan to stabilize the shoreline on his property, noting that the existing shoreline has some erosion and damage. He submitted a plat of survey and details of the proposal.

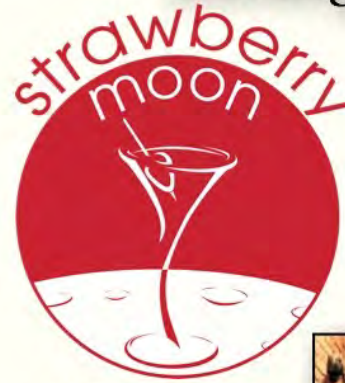
The grounds above the Gazebo were cleared, weeded and landscaped -- an effort led by Tate Fisher, a 2015 BHS graduate. The grounds below the Gazebo were cleaned-up and landscaped with native plants -- an effort led by Stephen Yancey, a junior at BHS. The park also boasts a new path to the lake.

The Gazebo commands a wonderful overlook of the main lake. The work included power washing, foundation repair, path construction and general cleanup. The roof -- which was in bad shape -- was replaced by a professional roofing team.

This pleasant park will need many years of stewardship moving forward and an official re-opening will be scheduled in the spring. In the meantime, if you haven't been to the west side lately, come take a look and enjoy the view from a newly renovated Lindy Lewis Park and Gazebo.
