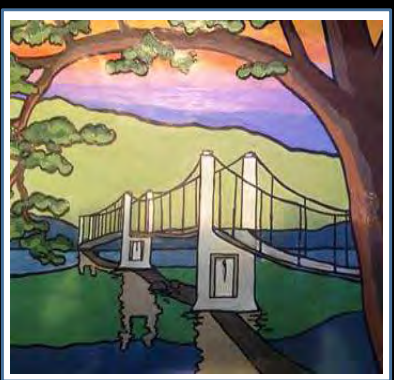

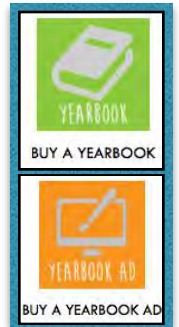

It's September and along with back-to-school, football, and looking forward to a Cubs World Series, it is TLIA budget time. Yes, a time of crunching the numbers, balancing committee requests, and cross-checking needs and wants. It's also a time to review our finances and make sure we are living up to our pledge of transparency and openness.

As to the review part, well we are looking very hard at next year based on performance of revenue this year. As to transparency... well here is a transparent number we should all know by now; there are 48 delinquent accounts totaling \$20,437 in outstanding dues owed to the Association.

Dues are the life blood of TLIA. Without them, we have nothing! No lake, events, youth, communications, grounds maintenance, tree maintenance, 4th of July, tennis courts, silt removal...the list is very long and you know it as well as I do... get the picture? Without your dues, we can not function as an association.

I realize that if you are reading this you are probably not the problem. You've met your obligation and are enjoying all the benefits of TLIA. But those who have not paid are also enjoying and benefiting from our Association's services. I just don't see that as equitable to anyone.

If the outstanding balances were paid off today, we would not even consider a dues increase or service cut backs. But that is not the case; and in this season of budget creation and membership reviews, we are considering both.

It is time to reduce the 17% non-collectable dues allowance in the budget; it's time for those who ignore their obligations to step up. I would much rather be cheering on the Cubs and tossing a football or raking leaves with my grandsons, but instead I have to knock on doors, send letters, make phone calls and maybe, just maybe, ask you in November to accept a budget of rate hikes and cut backs.

Police Funds Drive Proposal

Bill Hare

Bill Hare presented a proposal to honor the Tower Lakes police force. He commended the police for their work, in particular for the numerous vacation checks they provide for residents who are away. Bill proposed funding half of the cost of the purchase of lighter weight protective vests for our 18 part-time police officers. These vests, which have expiration dates, cost approximately \$700 apiece. Half of this \$700 has to be paid by the individual officers. The department is also in need of a widescreen TV for training. Bill asked for the TLIA Board's endorsement and help with publicity for this fundraising campaign. The Tower Lakes Foundation has already been contacted and is interested in participating in this fundraising effort. Bill will publicize it in the September newsletter and the TL Foundation fund drive will run through the end of December. Bill would also like to set up a benevolent fund for the police department in the future.

Motion by Randall Cross: To endorse the purchase of 50% of the cost of these protective vests and the cost of a widescreen TV.

Board Agrees With Committee Recommendation

Tennis courts remain blue

In a unanimous vote, the TLIA Board followed the guidelines of the Tennis Courts Committee and voted last month to NOT repaint the new tennis courts. The vote came on August 15 at the TLIA Board meeting held at Lake Barrington Shores.

The tennis court color controversy started shortly after the courts were painted and stripped. It was then that several homeowners, who live adjacent to the courts, complained about the light blue color which surrounds the playing surface. Those homeowners attended the June board meeting where they presented the Board with a signed petition indicating their dismay with the color choice and asked the board to repaint the courts to a more "green" color choice. At the July board meeting, the Tennis Court Committee was charged with conducting further research on the following points:

- Research the cost of repainting the exterior section of the courts;
- Determine whether the courts can be repainted within four (4) months without peeling or flaking;
- Determine if any special preparation or treatment would be needed prior to repainting;
- Verify what colors can be painted over the existing color on the outside of the courts;
- Research the top three (3) color combinations in general use over the past few years; and
- Research examples of courts with blue on blue and examine photos for evidence of fading over time.

The Tennis Court Committee met on August 4 to further research the above points and came up with answers to each one. A report was presented to the Board which contained a summary of their research. After reviewing their additional research, the Tennis Court Committee unanimously voted to recommend to the board that they NOT repaint the tennis courts. Their report cites several reasons for their decision, not the least of which was the cost. On August 15, at the TLIA Board meeting, the Board unanimously accepted the committee's recommendation and moved NOT to fund the repainting the tennis courts. However, there was one casualty: the big yellow tent used as a cover for the performance area on Rest Island. It landed in the dumpster at the end of the festivities.



The tent was old, torn and had seen much better days. This year, it was jimmy rigged with rope, tape and sticks to stay erect over the bands. "It had holes and tears in it," said Bob Nash, a member of the Events Committee. He went on to say, "It was pieced together with spit and gum. We decided to finally throw it away because we didn't think it would make it another year, not to mention the fact that it's probably unsafe." Bob should know, he booked the performers and played under the tent during the weekend.

The Events Committee has begun looking into the potential of a new stage cover for July and other activities at Rest Island. At the same time, a few Tower Lakes residents have been working independently on an alternative idea. "There is a group of residents who are interested in a more permanent solution to the staging on Rest Island," said TLIA President Randy Young. Plans are not ready to be reviewed yet as the group is still in the idea stages, but their thought is to provide a more permanent fixture on Rest Island.

The Board, at the August meeting, decided to create a committee to explore the issue. Several questions will be faced when and if any plans are submitted to the Board. The charge to the committee was to develop what the Board feels is needed on Rest Island and use it as a benchmark against any plans proposed by Events or the resident group.

Tower Lakes Men's Day - The History and Legacy

The year? 1987... a large number of families had moved into Tower Lakes over the previous three-year period. In an effort to foster brotherhood and camaraderie this group of late 20 and 30 something men, along with a few "older" gentlemen, got together to map out an array of men's activities. They planned fishing trips, breakfast club, weekly softball and touch football games as well as a few other male-bonding activities. The leaders of the pack were John Gillett, Jon "OJ" Simpson, Tom Hannagan, Pat McKillen, Bill Evans and a few others, whose names cannot be mentioned here. Their crowning achievement was to create a full day of gluttonous, "manly" activities. John Gillett dubbed this day the... **"Annual Autumnal Equinoctial Spheroidal Men's Day"** or as we now know it... **MEN'S DAY!**

The first event was held at the original Chalet Golf Course, then an 18-hole par 69 course. It was followed by softball, volleyball, and tennis back here in TL. As if that weren't enough, it ended with a steak dinner, poker and merriment at the Gillett home. In the spirit of full disclosure, it may have included an adult beverage or two or three. Subsequent Men's Days were planned by new volunteers (changing yearly), usually ending up at someone's home. 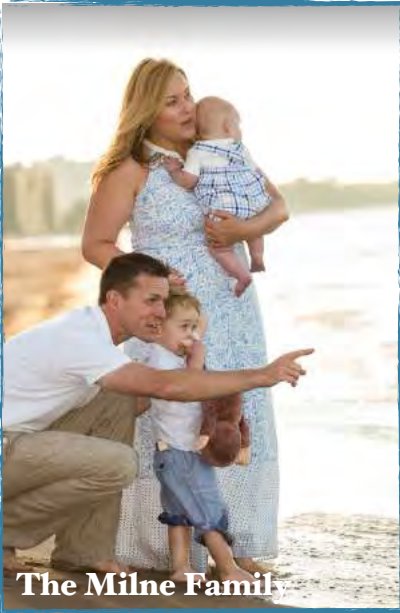

Getting to Know Your Neighbor Andrew Milne

As kids return full force to the new school year, there is a special teacher within our neighborhood that many are drawn to and you should know. Andrew ("Andy") Milne, who is not only a familiar face in Tower Lakes, but is the *2016 Illinois Health Teach of the Year!* This very prestigious award recognizes outstanding teaching in the area of health and physical activity. In only his 4th year teaching at New Trier High School on the north shore, Andy has made an obvious impact.

It started in England, where he was born. Andy went to school at Exeter University to study Physical Education and English. He was a wonderfully successful physical education teacher at 3 schools in London, finishing his time in England at an all-boys school, similar to what you see in the Harry Potter movies. He owned his own home in a popular district, had family nearby and was involved in many activities. But his life was about to take a turn. It was during that time that he met the love of his life, Caroline Adams. Caroline was visiting Piccadilly Circus with girlfriends. The pub they were in was minutes from closing time when the two met and there was an instant cross-Atlantic connection. For 2-1/2 years, Andy and Caroline commuted between the U.S. and England before deciding to get married in 2008. That relationship brought Andy to the states and eventually to our neighborhood where he is a common sight, leading some of the Tower Lakes activities.

Andrew has emceed many Tower Lakes July 4th events, including the most recent Lip Sync Night. "He's a natural performer with great stage presence and an incredible sense of timing," says Randy Young, who is a television director by trade and TLIA President. Andy also donates lots of his time to the TLIA Youth Committee by coaching little ones on the fundamentals of soccer or the adults on the basics of cricket. He uses his wit and charm to encourage the meek and mild into participation. "His humor and positive attitude go a long way in getting my kids to enjoy themselves," says one mother who brings her children to many of the Youth Committee activities.

It's that same combination of charisma he uses in his job teaching high schoolers the importance of health and physical literacy. But at work, he adds an undeniable weapon: technology. Using social media like no other, he blogs, tweets, and shares his observations. He asks the kids to do the same with their assignments.... and they respond. "I use technology to raise their game. If I give a student an assignment and ask for it back, it's merely an exchange between teacher and pupil. However, if I ask them to share it with a wider audience, it raises their game by allowing them to share their creations with a global audience. It deepens their engagement and makes them more accountable for what they are doing," says Andy. "In one assignment, I actually ask them to create a movie for all to view. And then I create an award ceremony, similar to the Oscars. It's a popular part of my course and all vie for the golden statue. This technique bridges the gap from classroom to kids to community." It's no wonder he's so popular with the students. He's innovative and dynamic.

Andy takes this creativity to other areas of life as well. He's a keen photographer and a music lover, preferring jazz and soul. "I'm an old soul with an urban twist, who loves to make music mixes for others." But his most passionate hobby is cooking. He was inspired by Jamie Oliver (the brash British celebrity chef best known for creating healthy lunches for school children). Andy has hundreds of cook books and experiments mostly with Italian cuisine. His favorite, however, is baking bread. "It's a simple way to show love. Warm the bowl, sift the flour, move your hand through the dough and feel the love. It just tastes better when you add the emotion to it." He's teaching his 4- and 2-year old boys to bake as well. A recent Instagram© post featured his 2-year old baking bread with him. You could almost smell the bread baking while you see the love between father and son.
