... While Accident Ruins Brick Village Marker

At 2:00 am on May 18, a car veered off Robert Road and crashed into the brick village marker at the West Lake Shore Drive entrance to Tower Lakes. According to the police report, a single car was involved, driven by a 19-year old male from Bartlett. The responding officer, R. Dador, stated



that two Tower Lakes residents heard the accident and called 911. The residents stayed with the young man until emergency assistance arrived. He was not seriously injured but cited for two violations: 5/11-601(a) (failure to reduce speed to avoid an accident) and 5/11-502 (transportation/

possession of alcohol in a motor vehicle). Cuba Township has already replaced the stop and street signs, which were ruined in the accident. The brick marker will be replaced by the Village of Tower Lakes.

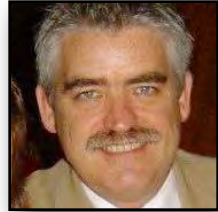

NOTES FROM THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Last month, I invited residents to write this column for me. Here are two commentaries I received. I appreciate the time and effort to comment and encourage others to write your thoughts when inspired.

As a health teacher I have conversations with my students on a daily basis and encourage them to think about the impact of their choices and behaviors upon their health. But health is more than just encouraging healthy decision making, promoting communication skills, analyzing influences and setting healthy goals, etc. Today's students are encouraged to consider not only their own health but also the health of others. When discussing inequity in health, I ask my students to think, often for the first time, about the role that their community plays upon their health, which inevitably has me thinking about my own community.

Tower Lakes is not only a wonderful place in which to live and raise families, it also plays a large role in shaping our health. Think about the facilities that surround us, each one making it easier for us to socialize and be active - the list of available activities is long, each one improving our physical, mental and social health. Our kids can paddle and swim surrounded by lifeguards and neighbors, each one looking out for the safety of our young ones. Our prized asset, the lakes, are managed responsibly and kept free of pollution, and other special interest groups not only keep us connected but serve to improve our environment.

Our crime levels are low, we have a friendly and effective police service and we don't have to worry about our safety as much as many other communities. We have a strong sense of trust within our community, and I tell my students that strong ties and trust among people within neighborhoods is associated with better health.

Volunteerism within our community is strong, and many adults give their time for the improvement of the environment and to others. We all have the opportunity to contribute to the betterment of our community. We can serve on committees, coach sports to kids, host guests for the progressive dinner or sign up to run an event over July 4th. This willingness to give back to our community is a great way to model the behavior that we expect of our younger residents, and the visibility of positive role models is another strength of Tower Lakes. I tell my students that children in supportive neighborhoods, with visible role models are more likely to receive adult guidance and less likely to engage in health-damaging behaviors.

As I reflect on how communities shape our health I am thankful for my community and for those individuals who put time and effort into making Tower Lakes a place of which I am proud to call home.

I lived in Tower Lakes for over 10 years and recently moved to the western suburbs to be closer to work. I didn't realize until I moved away how much you have done as president of our homeowner's association. I wish I would have told you of my appreciation for all you've done for our community. I wish I would have volunteered more. I don't know any of my new neighbors. It's really sad. I hope your dogs are well. *Sincerely, D.M.*

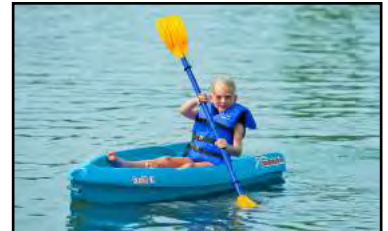

Illinois Drops Boating License for Rafts, Kayaks, Canoes

If it doesn't have a motor, you don't need a state license to float it on an Illinois lake, river, or pond. The state's Department of Natural Resources (DNR) announced that it is doing away with stamps for non-motorized watercraft because it proved tough to attach to some watercraft. The change takes effect June 1.



The IDNR and TLIA encourages residents with rafts, kayaks and canoes to purchase three-year registrations for the case of loss, theft or accident; however, it is not required. Three-year registration with the DNR costs \$18. TLIA boat stickers are free and distributed annually.

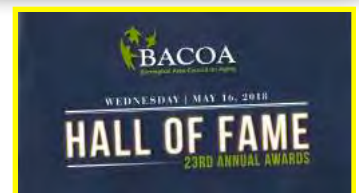

ANOTHER TL EAGLE SCOUT

Those of us who are lucky enough to live here know, in so many ways, what a special community Tower Lakes is. One of those reasons is the amount of Eagle Scouts that Tower Lakes has produced in recent years. And in a ceremony last month at Lutheran Church of the Atonement in Barrington, one more was added and that young man is Andrew Messerschmidt.



Andrew's trail to Eagle Scout was a relatively quick one in BSA terms. He became a Boy Scout just 5 years ago 2013, and by 2014 he had risen to the rank of First Class Scout. By 2016

he was a Life Scout and not quite 2 years later, he had completed the criteria to rise the rank of Eagle Scout. He earned far beyond the required Merit Badges needed for the highest level available to Boy Scouts but it is his Eagle Service project that is most impressive.

Andrew chose to help a refugee family from Africa by turning a vacant apartment in Chicago's Rogers Park neighborhood into their new home here in the United States. Through Exodus World Services he was connected with a young family of four (4) from Eretria, who had lived in a refugee camp for 9 months.

His project was three-fold: collecting, sorting and delivering donated items for the family's new apartment. Andrew turned to the people he knew he could count on, his family, the members of his church, his fellow Scouts of BSA Troop 29, and his neighbors in Tower Lakes. Along with all of the items he received from the generosity of so many, and a grant from Thrivent Financial, he was able to gather all of the necessary donations.

He then coordinated a group of volunteers to help with sorting the items and packing the van for a trip to the city. Once there they cleaned, set up the apartment and watched with a warm sense of satisfaction as they welcomed the most pleasantly surprised and appreciative family into their new home.

It is that time of year again to get out your white shirts, get good and messy, and take part in one of Hinduism's great festivals...Holi! This year we are reviving the barbeque we did last year down at the soccer field, and we once again welcome all of our neighbors to stop by and take part.

Holi is a celebration of spring marking the passing of winter and the triumph of good over evil. Technically this year it was back on March 2...but that is waaay too cold here in Chicagoland, so we are doing this June 2. It is also a festival to celebrate burying the hatchet and letting go of old disputes. The festival is marked by a large bonfire the night before, followed by a citywide colored powder and

water gun fight and ends with the sharing of a meal with friends and family.

This year, like last, we will be celebrating this with a BYO-barbeque. Bring what you want to grill and drink, and maybe a little extra to



share. We will provide the barbeque and the colored powder! This is a very BYO event, bring what you need for the bbq including chairs, tables, utensils, etc.

This is a messy event. Holi is celebrated with a colored powder fight and a water gun fight. The powder is food dyed cornstarch. Participants are encouraged to wear white shirts (the powder shows up much better); other clothing should be anything you don't mind getting extra messy and possibly stained.

The pressing question this spring is... “What’s up with the lake and all the algae?”

The answer is not simple. According to the Lake Committee, We have suffered from a perfect storm of conditions that contributed to the algae bloom over the recent holiday weekend. It included the heavy rains throughout May that brought nutrients from the neighborhood into the lake, combined with the hot sunny calm Memorial Day weekend and “bloom!” We have algae. Also contributing is the widespread presence of curly leaf pondweed, which is touching the surface, providing a spot for the algae to grow and stay at the surface.

ILM (TLIA’s lake consulting firm) is recommending a herbicide treatment as the next step to address the pondweed. This will help take away the “weed” variable part of the equation. Their plan is to provide TLIA with a recommendations on what areas to treat, based on what they have seen in the lake and once a consensus is found, treat the lake. ILM is mobilizing to do this work as soon as possible. The Lake Committee is predicting the week of June 4, depending on weather conditions. ILM believes that with the chemical and dosage they are recommending, a one time treatment will be what is needed to address the pondweed issue.

Since the herbicide is not designed to attack algae, the planned treatment may not have a big impact on algae presence. There could be some decrease in algae by eliminating the “support plants,” so a future algacide treatment would be needed. ILM is suggesting that a follow up visit, after the herbicide is applied, to review next steps. It may be possible to combine the treatments plans (weeds and algae). That idea is being researched as well.

ILM is planning on attending our next Lake Committee meeting on Monday June 4. The membership is encouraged to attend with your questions about this recommended approach to treating the lake.

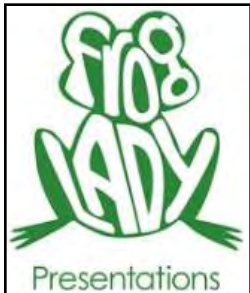
