Observations of a CFC Volunteer

Like many, I was drawn to the Barrington area by its iconic open green spaces. I quickly learned this was thanks to the foresight and efforts of a few concerned citizens decades ago. They became Citizens for Conservation (CFC), worked to identify lands and organize with others who valued nature. Their efforts created a defining positive impact on our area. So I became a member of CFC but it wasn't until recently that I became an active volunteer. I wanted to do something to help our environment and decided to invest my time locally where I could have a direct impact. What I discovered about CFC volunteers was special. Here are some observations.

CFC's volunteer-based culture – The culture is welcoming, results oriented, highly respected, always sharing knowledge, inclusive, and supportive. Volunteers are CFC's core. This not-for-profit produces big results but has only one part-time employee and a hardworking board of directors in support of its dedicated volunteers. CFC also has strategic partnerships with other respected conservation organizations and foundations.

Who are volunteers – Volunteers have varied backgrounds and skills. Examples: attorney, teacher, single parents, NFL player, HR exec, IT consultant, small business owner, musician, sky diving instructor, engineer, and various levels of students. Others come from backgrounds in medicine, manufacturing, banking, marketing, retail, and more. Some come from other communities. But it is a 'level playing field' with everyone working together and dedicating their energy to help nature.

Why they volunteer – Responses include: Joy of making a difference, investing in the future for the next generation, first-hand learning opportunities, social networking, and contributing a wide variety of skills. For some it is being outside or getting exercise at their own pace; several said they cancelled their gym memberships and are now in the best shape of their lives. For others it is helping with inside roles, some from their home computers and on their own scheduled times. Many come for the multigenerational activities. One person started in order to

Hello Neighbors!

Obviously the water main construction project is in full swing and causing some disruptions, including to this year's parade route. Thank you for your patience as we make these significant improvements. More details are in the July 1 Village e-newsletter.

As you know, Village law generally does not allow fences around yards and limits decorative fences to 30'. The Village is considering a zoning law change recommended by our Plan Commission to allow garden fences with some restrictions, including 6' height, 400 sq. ft. size and see-through materials. There will be a public hearing on July 16. If you have an opinion, please attend and give us your input.

By the way, I have appointed Jeannie Hancock, of Country Club Estates, to fill a vacancy on the Plan Commission. I am also looking for another volunteer who is interested in this work and available for one Wed evening a month.

Last but not least, I want to announce that Tower Lakes is growing! Literally & physically growing in the geographical sense. We have accepted the petition for annexation of the Weiner family at 1 Whitetail Trail and expanded the Village border to now include them. Their property is at the intersection of Indian Trail Rd and Whitetail Trail, across the street from Country Club Estates subdivision. Whitetail Trail will remain a private road. I hope that those of you who do not already know them will have an opportunity to introduce yourselves to Jordan & Margaret and their delightful family, who are very excited to be a part of the town we all love and contribute to its success. What they get in return – Volunteers talk about the thrill and reward of seeing rare native plants and trees bloom in areas restored by their handy work, sharing the moment of discovery and excitement through the eyes of a youth learning about the magic of nature, seeing native animals and birds return and thrive, helping residents integrate native plants into their landscapes, and benefiting from improved ecosystems helping to control erosion and purifying our waters. Everyone notes opportunities for personal continual learning and developing new friendships.



Results - CFC has been a major force in making Barrington the desirable setting that it is today. It continues to help nature deliver benefits through actively preserving and restoring acres of lands, annually providing conservation education that starts in elementary schools and continues all the way through adult sessions, and providing hands-on learning and sharing of expertise. New plans call for even bigger conservation opportunities to benefit residents: Barrington Greenway Initiative.

Volunteering has been a positive experience for me. I have learned a tremendous amount, made new friends, been able to contribute, and have a positive impact locally. 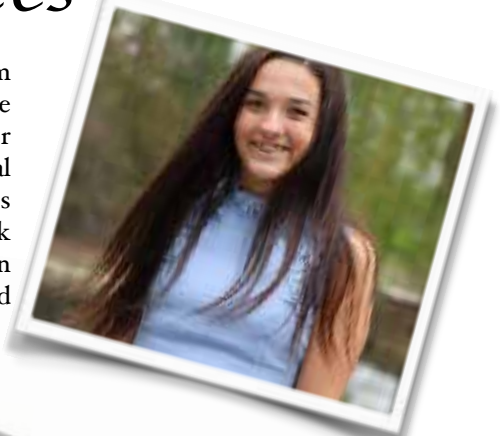

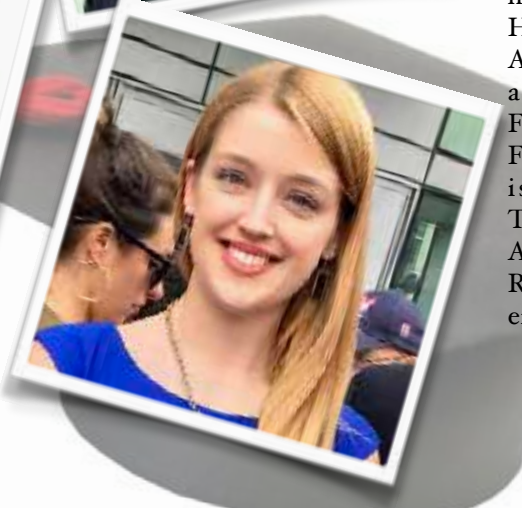

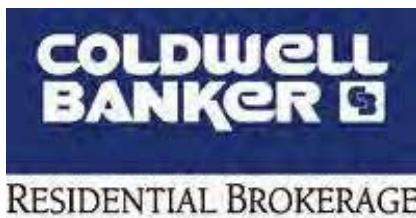

SPECIAL NOTICE OF PARADE RE-ROUTING

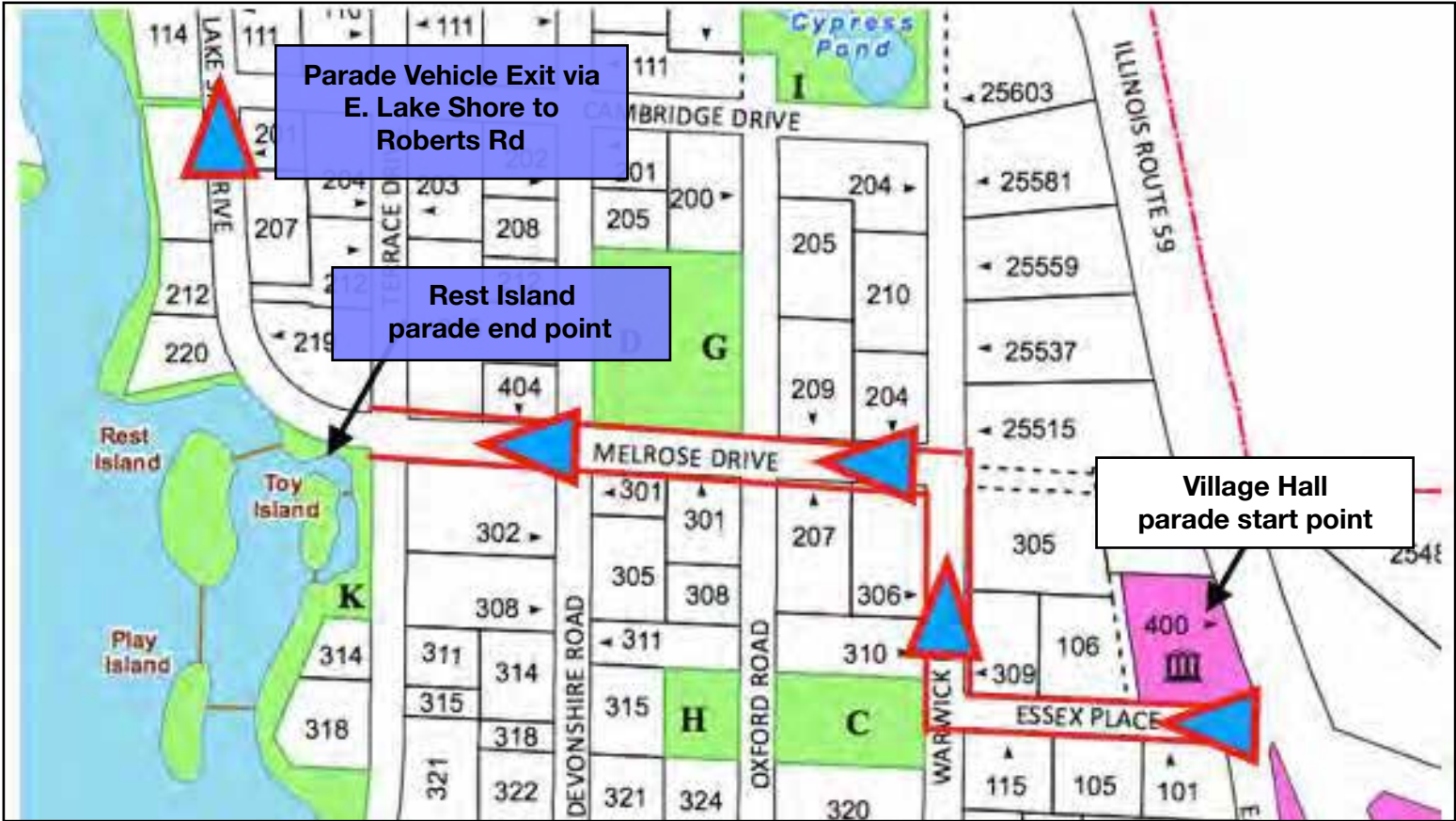

The route will be:

- Exit right from parking lot at Village Hall

 - Right turn - north on Warwick
 - Left turn - west on Melrose
 - End at the curve at E. Lake Shore (Rest Island entrance)
 - Parade vehicles will exit the neighborhood via E. Lake Shore to Roberts Rd.
- **The west end of Essex** (the intersection of Essex & Warwick) will be blocked for all traffic on the morning of the fourth to allow the parade to be assembled without vehicle traffic in either direction on Essex.
 - The **Drop-off zone** for parade people and floats will be along **E. Gateway Drive**. This will allow vehicles to drop-off participants and then exit to Hwy 59. There will be **NO PARKING on E. GATEWAY PRIOR TO THE PARADE**.
 - **The flag raising ceremony** featuring the Presentation of the Colors, the National Anthem, Pledge of Allegiance and award of parade ribbons will follow the parade.
