FROM THIS PERCH

As you read this article it is now May and we have completed 1/3 of the calendar and TLIA fiscal year 2019. So much has already happened this year with many new people involved in the activities. To date, we have had numerous Youth and Social events, the lakes are receiving their first treatments for algae and the common parks and grounds are beginning to grow, being trimmed and receiving mulch. The Annual Spring Grounds and Lake Clean-Up occurred on April 27 and the always popular Progressive Dinner is scheduled for May 4.

Dues are being received and the Treasurer is paying the bills. Our past Treasurer is now the VP and helping to prepare for our first independent audit of our financial affairs. Lastly, a newly appointed Long-Range Planning Committee is working on a long-term strategy for our parks, grounds and boat landings while the Lake Committee works on their long-range plan. There is more happening here in TL than any of our neighboring communities have in a year.

In 2018 the Finance Committee developed a new template for budgeting and monthly reporting. In doing so, we have now divided our detailed budget and expenses into three categories: 1) Common Areas; 2) Committee Activities; 3) Administration. By law, the principal role of the Board is to protect the common areas (property) in the community. Accordingly, we have budgeted over half of our expenses on the Lakes and Grounds. In 2019 we increased our expense allocation to the lake, as it continues to eutrophy (age and fill in). We have planned a more aggressive approach to attack algae and plant growth as soon as practical. In addition, we are preparing the boat landings over time, to deploy a weed harvester (as we did in 2018), if necessary. Clearly, we all benefit from a healthy and sustainable lake, clean and well-maintained play areas, parks and colorful entrances.

Those Committees which offer social based Activities i.e. Youth, Events, Beach, Tennis, etc. and their many volunteers, work to craft TL's cool, traditional activities, as well as incorporating new and unique ones for our children, adults and guests. All this effort helps to enhance the enjoyment of our parks and lakes. Communications is included in this category, as this important committee works hard to ensure our members are aware of the details about all the FUN events in the neighborhood.

Committee activities are more "pay to play" and that is why these committees receive a very modest allocation from member dues, while the principal funding to support the activities comes from fees, donations, and advertising, as determined by each committee. Committee funding is budgeted at roughly 20% of total expenses but, be reminded that 90% of that is offset by incoming committee revenue NOT dues.

Administrative expenses include insurance (roughly one half the category), member services, website, email account, etc. These are expenses that support the Association, the properties and the community. These administrative expenses are very important but the Board is compelled to keep these expenses as low as possible. In 2019 the Board assigned only 13% of the budget (down from 2018) to Administrative expenses. The remainder of the budget is allocated to depreciation and our annual contribution to the Capital fund for long term capital improvements of the parks, beach, and lake as needed.

2019 Dues Collection Update

submitted by the TLIA Finance Committee

March 31 was the final deadline for 2019 Dues payments

As of April 1, \$25,288 was still outstanding and owed to the community. This breaks out to:

- \$15,700 is from 2019 Dues. There has been no contact from these homeowners and this money is not committed via a payment plan. On April 3, twenty-three (23) late fee invoices for \$100 each were sent to these homeowners.
- \$4,999 is from 2018 Dues & prior. (\$2737 of which is Dues and \$2262 is Legal fees for Court collection effort on one property owner, which should be resolved/collected by the Court late in April.)
- \$4589 is also from 2019 Dues, but this money has been committed to TLIA via payment plans.

IN MEMORIAM ...

Pertuu Laakso and Dorothy Pratt

Pertuu "Pepe" Laakso was born here in Tower Lakes. His parents, Pertuu and Toni, lived in 2 other homes before settling on the lake side of East Lake Shore Drive, where his mom still lives today. Pertuu moved away for college but his love of the outdoors and Tower Lakes brought him and his wife, Betsy, back in 1998 to raise their family. Coincidentally, his late brother, Jan and wife, Judy, moved back at the same time. He enjoyed sailing on the lake and being with people, so it was natural to take his girls, Anne and Maggie to the beach, Easter Egg Hunt and of course, the July 4th Parade. As a young Boy Scout, Pertuu, himself had been a part of the flag raising ceremony on the island. Betsy and Pertuu loved their time on the Social Committee and continued to help out whenever possible. Pertuu passed away in March. Our condolences to this true TL family.

For those of you who have been around here for awhile, we received word that former Tower Lakes resident, Dorothy Pratt, passed away recently at age 95. Dorothy and her late husband, George, who passed away just months earlier, originally lived in a small cottage in TL but when their family outgrew it, they built a larger home on the lake on West Lake Shore Drive. Both Dorothy and George volunteered and held numerous positions in TLIA. George is remembered as a Village Trustee and Dorothy most notably, for writing articles for the TLIA newsletter for 28 years. Thank you George and Dorothy for your service.

HI NEIGHBORS!

Spring has sprung as I write this and the season, as always, has brought out a flurry of home improvement activity. Please remember that Building Permits are needed for all projects involving electrical or plumbing or structural changes, as well as window, roof or driveway replacements. We want to encourage improvements to be made so we keep permit fees low enough to just cover costs. However we also have a responsibility as a government to keep you and your property safe, and that includes doing our best to keep work up to codes and prevent substandard work. In recent weeks, a TL homeowner upgraded the electrical service to their home. A worker for the contractor failed to attach the new electric junction box to a ground, putting at risk the safety of the occupants, not to mention every powered device in the home. Fortunately, this owner had a building permit and the Village's Building Inspector found the problem in the final inspection and all was fixed. Don't take shortcuts that put your property value or safety at risk. Get a Building Permit.

I also have some great news to report for the 90% of the Village homes which are on the water system and who paid \$601 in Special Service Area 3 property tax last year. As promised, and based on the final loan amortization schedule worked out with our lender for last year's big water system upgrade, the remaining 19 years of SSA3 tax will be LOWERED to \$564. Thanks also to fast action by Village officials, this reduction has been recorded with the county in time to be reflected in tax bills being sent out next month.

Last, but not least, in the April 2 municipal election, three new Village Trustees were elected. These new public servants are **Chrissie Mena**, **Caroline Milne** and **Randy Speiss**. They will take office May 20, 2019. In the next newsletter I will have something to say about our new function heads, which will be shifting, plus some detailed thanks to our outgoing Board members.

Something Fishy!

On a cold and windy April day our lake became the new home for 1,500 blue gill. With the help of Tower Lake residents both young and old: Kathy Knight and Logan Knight, Lake Committee members, Tom Kubala and Will Knight supervised the release of our newest 3-5 inch residents. (Fish Department Head, Eric Torstenson was unable to attend.)

Why do we stock our lake? Its important to maintain a healthy fish population, both large and small, for many reasons:

Keep Northerns from preying on and depleting our bass population

Overall health of the ecosystem.

TL youth need a healthy population of bluegills, not just to fish for but to catch!

Maintain a healthy bluegill population to avoid stunting the growth of our predator fish (bass and northern pike)

We anticipate another stocking in the fall of bluegill and possibly other species of sunfish and perch to maintain our healthy fishery and ecosystem.

REMINDERS: - All resident fishermen and/or fishing guests must have a TLIA tag on their person.

- PLEASE, no fishing from bridges or Play Island.

- Fishermen (and all boaters) **under 13 must be wearing a life jacket while on the water**, not just have it on the boat.

- Fishermen aged 16 and older **must have an Illinois fishing license**.

If you do not have a TL tag or have misplaced yours, you can pick up a new one from Members Services in the Beach Parking Lot from 10:00 a.m.–12:00 p.m. on Sunday May 5 and Saturday May 11, 2019 (See Members Services Note page 1.)

Unfortunately, we have been experiencing high numbers of trespassers over the past few weeks, so now it is more important than ever to be on the lookout for non-residents fishing on or around our lake. A few quick reminders of what to do if you suspect a trespasser: -**Do not approach a potential trespasser**.
