## FROM THIS PERCH

Hello neighbors.

Spring has sprung and it is almost summer. Like

last year, we had a ton of water to deal with and cooler than normal temperatures. After a relatively dry winter the ground is now saturated as we try to keep up with outdoor activities and spring plantings. The sun does come out sometimes and everything has begun to grow and grow... and the TLIA member-owned grounds are growing lush, green and beginning to flower. Thank you to Grounds Beautification and all the volunteers who plant the annuals at our entrances and parks.

Thank you, also, to all our volunteers who helped us out on Lake and Grounds Clean up Day. (see article on p.6) In addition to trimming and maintenance at the islands and boat landings, we tackled a few other important and needed projects. We cleared the entry to the Main Lake from North Lake by removing debris from the inlet under Roberts Road.

Barsumian Park received its annual manicuring in advance of much needed capital improvements. (At the May TLIA meeting the Board approved up to \$8000 to repair/replace the 270 foot wall that has been unsafe and in disrepair. This work should be complete by the end of summer). Lastly, a group of vigorous South Hills folks began the creation of a new park at Zupancic Park on Rose Terrace.

Now, I need to address a very important subject – TRESPASSING. Over the winter we endured a large number of trespassing incidents when uninvited fisherman entered our property, set down their fishing gear, cut holes in the ice and fished on our lakes. To add insult to their actions, they taunted our Lake Committee, broadcast their fishing excursion for over 12 minutes on a YouTube feed, and linked it to three of their sponsors websites. These fishermen benefitted from our private lake resources and received well over 800,000 “hits” on the websites. The result of those activities was a rush of unwanted fishermen on our lakes.

Trespassing, by definition, is **“to enter the owner’s land or property without permission.”** From TLIA By-Laws, Article III, Section 3, **“The property of the Association shall be for the exclusive enjoyment and benefit of its members and their families including their guests, and for no other purposes whatsoever.”** Quite simply, TLIA properties, our parks and lakes, are private property. Collectively, the 360 private homeowners of TLIA own our lakes and parks. TLIA members pay for the maintenance and improvement of the properties without public funding. We invite all TLIA members and welcome their guests to enjoy our community amenities. TLIA also has a Recreational Family Pass Program (RFPP), established in 1995, more than 20 years ago, whereby all other Village of Tower Lakes residents, that are not members of TLIA, can enjoy TLIA lakes, parks, and activities by joining the RFPP program. Therefore, anyone not a TLIA nor RFPP member nor a guest of either, **that enters and uses our properties is “entering our property without permission” and is TRESPASSING.**

Trespassing, especially the volume we have seen recently, creates a potential danger to the community as well as an overuse and depletion of our fishing population, for which we pay. The potential danger is an increase of uninvited persons that we do not know. An extra 100 to 300 visits from uninvited trespassers increases the chance and exposure to individuals of questionable intent.

## HOW TLIA IS ADDRESSING THIS CONCERN

(REPUBLISHED from the February Newsletter)

The Lake Committee, in cooperation with the VOTL Police Department, has developed a policy and action plan to deal with Trespassers.

The following rules will apply for Tower Lakes fishermen and their guests:

1. All individuals fishing on our lake must be in physical possession of a valid and current TLIA tag. These tags are distributed by Member Services. If you need a new tag please, contact Kevin Middleditch: [memberservices@tlia.org](mailto:memberservices@tlia.org) (\*NOTE: Our lake is governed by DNR and IL State Law requires all fishermen 16+ years carry a valid fishing license.) If individuals do not have a TLIA tag while fishing, a valid driver’s license/ID must be presented that clearly shows they are a resident of Tower Lakes.
2. Unaccompanied Guests of Tower Lakes residents fishing our lake must have a valid TLIA tag. If they are not able to provide the tag, **they will be given the opportunity to get one from their Tower Lakes’ host. If they cannot procure one, they will be asked to leave.** These should only be lent to individuals on a daily basis because the resident is responsible for their access and actions. For instances where you suspect a fisherman may be trespassing, we understand that you may not wish to travel out onto the ice or wander the shorelines to inquire with a fisherman you may not know. In that case, the following are guidelines for communicating with a suspected interloper:
  3. Unsupervised Students/Children/Teenagers: If you are comfortable approaching them, ask for a TLIA tag, or information related to their residency. The TLIA directory can serve as a repository of information for those you may not know in the community. If they do not have a TLIA tag, or you simply suspect them of trespassing please reach out to your Lake Committee co-chairs to address with the police: Their numbers are here or in the TL Directory.(see p. 9) Tom Kubala-847-867-4979 Mitch Coulter-773-844-1953
  4. Adults suspected of being non-residents: If you are aware of someone fishing on the lake who you know to be a trespasser, please reach out to your Lake Committee co-chairs immediately. You will need to provide a general location for where the fisherman may be so that they can communicate effectively to the police. Tom Kubala-847-867-4979 Mitch Coulter-773-844-1953

Moving forward, the Beach Committee and Lake Committee will enforce the use of the TLIA Beach tags 1) WHEN AT THE BEACH, and 2) WHEN FISHING. Please begin to immediately use the tags during these activities. The Lifeguards, Beach Committee and Lake Committee can’t know or remember everyone who is a TLIA member. They will ask you to retrieve your beach tags if they cannot identify you. Providing your address and an ID is not an acceptable response. The beach tags are your proof of membership.

We really wish we did not have to take these actions, but electronic media has made it easy to spread the word with pictures and a LOT of people now know about our excellent fishing habitat. We need to protect our personal property and guard our safety.

## Tower Lakes Raingardens and Bioswales Project Update - THE BIG DIG 2 HAS STARTED

**At the time of writing this we have just broken ground on Phases II and III of the Raingardens Project.** After months of waiting for permits from the Army Corps and the right kind of weather, and JULIE (who took almost three weeks to show up) we eventually started the construction of the second smaller raingarden in Wagner Pk (known to many as East Boat Landing) and the restoration of the wetland in the same area.

The clock was ticking on these projects and I have to confess to getting nervous. The three year window of the ILEPA 319(h) Grant expires at the end of July 2019 and we have to be

100% completed at that time with all the reports written and submitted in order to get the reimbursement that these projects depend upon. Anyway, by the time you are reading this the engineering will be done. The garden will be sculpted to catch as much of the run off on the east side as possible, detaining it and allowing it to infiltrate rather than run straight down the drains and over the turf grass into the lake, carrying

with it all of the pollutants and nutrients that we are trying to remove. In total this garden is 5000 sq ft and designed to infiltrate up to 16 inches of rainfall per hour. Anything over that will flow into the overflow pipe and down to the lake and in extreme high rainfall (25 yrs high's and above) would run over the spillway.

This garden will take time to stabilize and for the plants to take root. Please watch its progress during the season as you walk to the beach.



**In the meantime, maintenance has been done on the existing raingarden at Bays Pk.** We have learned a lot and continue to learn. Last year we had several people comment on how overwhelming one particular species of the native plants was becoming (The Obedience Plant, as pretty as it was, had become very *dis-Obedient!*) and was taking over. With the help of our environmental partner ENCAP we have removed that species and will plant some other flowering natives in its place. This shows that even native plants can become invasive in the right environments and grow so fast as to eliminate their neighbors.

This year we would be delighted if more people would consider planting even small raingardens on their property. Most of you have some area where water tends to pond or runoff erodes the soil. Please consider that for modest raingardens. They really don't have to be big and expensive to make a difference. Feel free to call for advice and I can put you in touch with master gardeners who know about which plants do well and where.

As ever, thank you all for your support and patience especially as much of East Boat Landing is out of commission for the early summer.

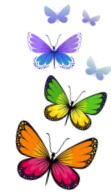

About 40 volunteers started early to sneak in 3 solid hours of hard work on many projects before the snow started and the temperature plunged.

We had three teams working to accomplish the following:

- ~ First with the aid of a lot of mechanical devices, Rich Bahr’s pick up and Jerry Metz’s tractor, a crew removed 2 dead water logged trees out of the water near Lathan’s landing and the channel under Roberts Rd. To top the morning off, many of the cold and soggy volunteers met at Latham’s Landing on North Lake to celebrate Arbor Day, sponsored by the TL Village Tree Commission. Great information about the care and selection of trees was handed out and a new tree was planted as the snow kept falling.

Anne Magro and Pat Covek once again, put together a fantastic lunch and made all the difference to the cold and hungry group of volunteers. Ladies, please, know that your efforts under the most difficult of weather circumstances, were greatly appreciated by all those in attendance.

All in all, it was a **great** TLIA work event to usher in another **great** season enjoying our **great** community of lakes, parks and urban forest.

A big thank you to all the volunteers and organizers of the work day. Despite Mother Nature and because of Mother Nature, it was a lot of fun and a great success!

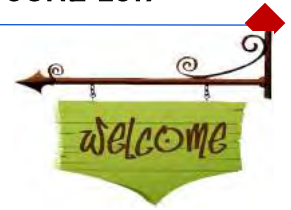

Hello neighbors,

On May 20, 2019 we welcomed three newly elected Trustees to our Village Board: Caroline Milne, Chrissie Mena and Randy Spiess. I look forward to working with them over the next four years to keep up the progress we have made on infrastructure, ecology, safety and preserving our property values while spending efficiently and prudently. They've all been productive contributors to our neighborhoods in other roles and I am confident that they'll continue to be so in their new roles.

I would like to take this opportunity to pass on heartfelt thanks to the three outgoing Trustees, whose immense unpaid volunteer efforts have made significant improvements to our government services and procedures and saved countless tax dollars over their years of service to our town as Village Trustees.

Donna Schardt, outgoing Finance Committee Chair, has served since 2011 and has helped keep our budgets tight, improved our financial processes, overseen annual audits and the work of two different Treasurers & multiple bankers while successfully navigating us through the crisis of a fraud attempt by outsiders.

Joe Skurla, our outgoing Roads & Stormwater Chair, and former Public Health Chair, has served since 2012. He was our director on the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County and helped negotiate a very beneficial, new garbage contract when our consortium group disbanded, resulting in improved & expanded services with fewer road-damaging trucks at a lower cost than our previous provider. He has also renegotiated our paving and plowing contract with Cuba Township, working with two different leaders there and planned and executed several hundred thousand dollars of road resurfacing and drainage improvements, while obtaining grants to cut costs. He began implementing best practices for drainage that were developed via our area-wide 9 Lakes Watershed study partnership. Most of all, he brought to the table his engineering skills and Fortune 500 executive management skills and contributed his wisdom to all of our decision making for the past 7 plus years.

Paul Kierig, our outgoing Utilities Chair, was elected in 2015 just as we were gearing up to move forward on what would become one of the largest projects in our history. Residents had approved a referendum to spend \$3.7mm on water system upgrades. Paul's energy, legal skills and corporate leadership skills were crucial in navigating through the myriad hoops involved in issuing bonds to the market, then finding a dramatically better opportunity via a special 1% federally subsidized loan, qualifying for it, getting the detailed design done, navigating the bidding process with its legion of complex state & federal requirements and then of course overseeing our engineers and contractors through the construction phase and wrangling communications with everybody involved, including residents. This all consumed easily over a thousand hours, including late nights & weekends and all done enthusiastically & without pay. Paul's legal background was also helpful on a monthly basis as he was able to consult on ordinance language, in many cases saving legal fees. We will miss his sound advice on a wide variety of topics.

Plaques of appreciation were presented to the outgoing Village Board members. Please say thank you next time you see one of them.

Also on May 20, I made the following Committee Chairperson appointments for the standing Committees of the Village Board which were all approved unanimously:

Finance Committee – Andy Hay  
 Planning, Building & Zoning Committee – Randy Spiess  
 Police & Grounds Committees – Rick Steffen  
 Roads & Stormwater Committees – Dave Burnidge  
 Utilities & Communications Committees – Chrissie Mena  
 Public Health & Environment Committee – Caroline Milne  
 Most of the Board will also serve on the ongoing ad hoc Committee studying a long range master plan for Facilities.

Finally, I would like say that in my final four years as your Village President my top two priorities (beyond sustainably maintaining everything great about the quality of life we enjoy in this exceptional town) will be a) upgrading our communication tools to give you better access to government info & services and to help support our image & property values; and b) to leverage public and private funding to begin moving forward in a cost effective manner with needed updates to our buildings, following the completion of a long range site development plan for our properties on Rt. 59.

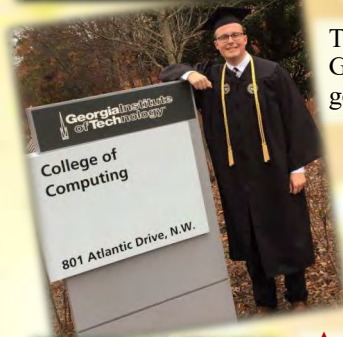

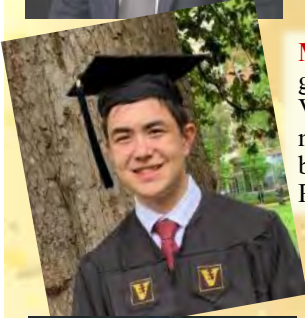

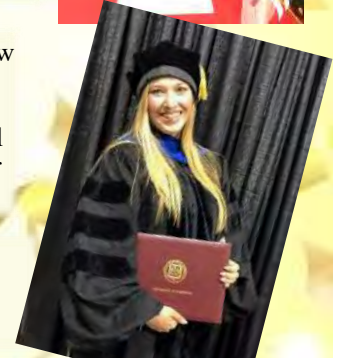
